First, I'd like to recommit myself and all of us to be welcoming at the KHYC. That's great PR for us, and we need to continue our outreach to the City government, the local Schools. and the Harbor community as a whole. Following on that point, a major priority of our club for some time is reaching our allowed membership amount of 550. If we can hold to 550 members and maintain a wait list, we will be ensuring that our future

is strong and getting stronger. It will make budgeting much easier and our ability to increase services better. It will grow our new building fund quicker. Having a wait list will also increase demand to join, reinforcing the strength of the organization. All of us can play an important role in recruiting members! If you bring a candidate forward, register them at the office, and they join, you will receive \$500 food and beverage credit, and the new member will also receive a \$500 food and beverage credit. I'm hoping that this program will provide the nudge that you all need to lean into this effort. If all of us brought forward one candidate, we'd be at our capacity all the time! We will continue to invest in our current facility, even as we save for a new one. It's vitally important that we have a high-quality experience here at the club, which means lots of upkeep and replacement of older assets. Look for noticeable improvements around the club this vear.

Finally, we are going to work to deliver amazing experiences for all of us. The King Harbor Yacht Club will look to compete in sailing, in fishing, and for recognition as a major club on the West Coast, and in the country. We will create cruising experiences and parties that will be indelible memories for all of us. This already started at the New Years Eve party which happened a few days before you received this Telltale, and continues with the Commodore's Ball on Saturday night, February 3rd. BOOK CLUB.

In December we reviewed "The New Earth" by Jess Row. At first, while reading the first couple of chapters I though: Oh no! Not another book about the New York Upper West side by another author complaining about his family's point of view of the world no less. However, even in this day and age, observing what is going on in the world; a negative point of view is inevitable. But still, how can he say such things about his own family? I ask!

Nevertheless, as it often happens with some authors, after explaining (or trying to explain) where their own point of view is coming from; they finally latch into the

actual book's subject and the narrative begins to make sense while the story becomes relevant. Then, and only then, reading such a book becomes some what interesting. But officially, there is no hall of fame for unhappy families. Even the staunchest Russian novelist

might be hard pressed to match the particular gift for dysfunction that the Wilcoxes (subjects of Jess Row's sprawling met a fiction - The New Earth) display with such impressive spirit de corps across nearly 600 dense and often wildly **discursive** pages. Death and divorce are a given, immigration, and crises of faith crowd the margins competing with the thousand-year conflict in the Middle East and the Zapatistas in Mexico. Incest eventually enters the chat, and race hovers over it all, a quivering question mark. Despite their Anglicized name, the Wilcoxes are an immediately recognizable type, New York's Upper West Side Jews long and comfortably defined by the bourgeois markers of their "lox-herring-and-Sunday-Times tribe", who have fully surrendered to the yuppified '80s!" New York Times review.

It seems to me that the thoughts Jess Row had while writing this book were: "Let me shock them, let me embarrass them, let me display my erudition!"
