NOTICE OF SERIES Rev A

A series of (6) race events hosted by KHYC. Races 1,2,3 and 5 qualify for ASMBYC High Point.

1. RULES

- 1.1 This series will be governed by the current Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) and PHRF of Southern California (PHRF). Class rules are available at <a href="https://phr.ncbi.nlm.ncbi.n
- 1.2 RRS 90.3 will apply.
- 1.3 The races of both series will be random legs (RLC) with approximate distances between 12 and 36 miles, with options for shortened courses (See NOR 7).
- 1.4 The commercial mooring field near the El Segundo offshore marine terminal described in federal regulations 162.195 is an obstruction and shall not be entered. (Refer to NOAA Nautical Chart 187480G).
- 1.5 Rule 51 is modified to allow the positioning of movable ballast on boats as designed, and the powered system is inoperable.
- 1.6 Rule 52 is modified to allow the use of winches operated using stored power as rated by PHRF SoCal.

2. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

2.1 Sailing Instructions (SIs) for each race will be posted on the official online notice board by approximately 1800 hours the Monday before each race.

3. COMMUNICATION

- 3.1 The official notice board is located online at KHYC.org/racing and posted in the Reinhardt room on the bulletin board.
- 3.2 All boats shall carry a VHF radio capable of communicating on domestic channels. The RC will communicate on VHF channel 78.

4. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 4.1 The event is open to boats possessing a current PHRF SoCal certificate. The same rating will be used for all 6 races to be eligible for the perpetual trophies.
- 4.2 Boats competing for the overall places in the KHYC Spinnaker, Berger, or Stein Series must enter and compete in that series/division for the duration of the series.

- 4.3 Eligible boats shall enter each race by filling out the Regatta Management Solutions (RSM) online entry form available at KHYC.org/racing. Entries must be received no later than 2000 hours on the Friday before each race. Late entries will be accepted only if approved by RC, and the entry fee will be increased by 25%.
- 4.4 Five or more boats constitute a class (i.e. multihull or double-handed) independent of the KHYC Spinnaker Series, the class authority may contact the RC to request a separate class or a subclass with an existing class.

5. FEES

- 5.1 The 2025 Spinnaker Series (six races) entry fee is \$140.00.
- 5.2 Individual races are \$35.00 each, with a \$10.00 discount per race until 2000 hours the day before the race

6. DIVISIONS & CLASSES

- 6.1 Based on initial registrations, PHRF classes will be established for the entire series using PHRF Area B RLC handicaps. They are based on relative performance potential and anticipated entries. PHRF Spinnaker Class A, B, and C assignments will be assigned the day before the first race.
- 6.2 Non-spinnaker offsets will not apply.
- 6.3 The RC reserves the right to reassign a boat from one class or division to another.

7. SCHEDULE Spin 1 – March 15th – Stoney Special

A race of approximately 10.3 NM using KHYC marks. A US Nearshore event. Randon leg ratings apply with TOT scorning. An ASMBYC High Point Race. Perpetual Trophy- Marold Eyestone Perpetual (PHRF A).

Spin 2 – April 12th Trans Habor

A race of approximately 22.1 NM using KHYC and MDR race marks. US Nearshore event. RLC ratings will apply to TOT scoring. An ASMBYC High Point Race. Perpetual Trophies – Fisherman's Race Perpetual – (PHRF A) & Jimmie Morris Perpetual (PHRF B).

Spin 3- June 8th Eagle Rock to MDR Race

The Eagle Rock to MDR race is also the second leg of a the DRYC Berger/Stein Series two-day regatta beginning and ending in Santa Monica Bay and crossing the San Pedro Channel between Point Vincente and Catalina Island, approximately 30 NM. A US Nearshore event. RLC Ratings will apply with TOT scoring. KHYC will score this spinnaker race for boats that register for that race. An ASMBYC High Point Race. Perpetual trophy – Lobster House Perpetual (PHRF A) & Brin Owen Perpetual (PHRF B)

Spin 4 June 14th KH2CBYC Race

A race of about 17NM from King Harbor to Cabrillo Beach via Angels Gate. A US Nearshore event. RLC ratings will apply to TOT scoring. Perpetual Trophy - H.A. Simms perpetual PHRF A & B

Spin 5 –Windward Leeward Regatta

A single multiple-leg race of approximately 10 NM using KHYC marks. A US Nearshore event. RLC ratings apply with TOT scoring.

Spin 6 – September 13th Matt Walsh

A single multiple-leg race of approximately 11.2 NM using both KHYC marks and PV10. A US Nearshore event. RLC ratings apply with TOT scoring. An ASMBYC High Point Race.

8 VENUES

- **8.1** Races will be sailed on the Santa Monica Bay and crossing the San Pedro Channel.
- **8.2** Boats must enter both clubs' series via KHYC.org and DRYC.org/racing to be scored for both.

9 SCORING

9.1 The USSA low point scoring system will apply except for scoring for DNC, DNS, DSQ, etc. will be one place more than the number of starts in each race. Each race will be scored separately with the lowest series total for 6 races with one throw-out. PHRF boats must race with a valid certificate, sail in 3 race events, and race with their spinnaker rating to qualify for series awards and perpetual trophies.

10 TROPHIES

10.1 There will be individual take-home trophies for each event. Perpetual trophies for each race, as noted in the NOS/Sis will be awarded to the PHRF winner during the annual race awards event. The "Bob Hight Memorial" Perpetual Trophy for Class A and the Spinnaker" Perpetual Trophy for Class B are awarded to the overall series winner.

11 HOSPITALITY

11.1 Participants are welcome to use the clubhouse, overnight guest dock, and hoist (6000 lbs. Max) in conjunction with each race. Refreshments are offered after the races.
