
it so much that he spent much of the rest of the evening looking for other bags or a box to climb into! Mama Tanya, was 'on it', though, and handled it like a pro!

CHRISTMAS REGATTA

King Harbor Christmas Regatta 1964

Did you know that in 1964, the King Harbor Yacht Club hosted over three hundred boats in its Christmas Regatta? Editor Margaret Falkard wrote, "The King Harbor Yacht Club breathed a sigh of relief and gratefully settled for light winds and dazzling sunshine instead of the predicted weekend of rain for their annual Christmas Regatta."

The 2024 Christmas Regatta shared the same weather but had fewer boats, thirty-three to be exact. In 1964 the boats were Thunderbirds, Cal 25, Feathers, Schock 25, Challengers, Victory, Cal -24, Cal-20s, Lidos, Snips, Omega-14, Win'ard Sabots, Naples Sabots just to name a few. Why the difference in competitors ... 1964 these boats were two-person boats. The PHRF boats today are much larger and need crews of six to eight crew. The only returning fleet from 1964 is our mighty Cal 20 Fleet. Some things change, some stay the same.

A huge thank you to Cub Race Officer, Brian Lavis with the "back of the boat crew," Linda Marland, Kathaleen Largo, Eagle Sams, Cindy Keyzer, and LynnDee Johnson were busy checking boats in, reading the wind, recording signals information to racers, and timer. 

"The Curve of Time" By: Muriel Wylie Blanchet.






In December we reviewed the enduring BC classic: "The Curve of Time"-Commemorative 50th Anniversary Edition, by Muriel Wylie Blanchet. This is the astonishing adventure story of a woman, who after being left a widow in 1957, packed her five children onto a 25 foot boat and cruised the coastal waters of British Columbia, summer after summer.

Muriel Wylie Blamchet (Capi) acted single handedly as skipper, navigator, engineer, helms' woman and, of course, mom, as she saw her "crew" through encounters with tides, fog, storms, rapids, cougars and bears. She sharpened in her children a special interest in the rich traditions of the area's First Nations Communities and in nature itself. In this book, she left us with a sensitive and compelling account of their journeys. Eileen Blanchet, wife of Capi's son.

As a sailor and book enthusiast, I totally agree with Eileen Blanchet, and specially recommend this book to you KHYC sailors! The story begins with a reference to a book that the crew was reading on board one Summer: The Fourth Dimension. That dimension being Time, which doesn't exist in itself (according to the author), but that is always relative to the person having the idea of Time; he used a curve to illustrate his theory: Standing in the present on the highest point of the curve, you can look back and see the Past, or look forward and see the Future, all from the same spot. But if you stand off to one side of this curve, your eye wanders from one side to the other without any distinction; and in dreams, the mind wanders in and out of the Present through the Past and the Future, unable to distinguish what has not yet happened and what has already befallen. He said that if you keep track of your dreams, writing them down as soon as you woke up, you would find that some were of things that already happened and others of future events. Capi thought that our consciousness roves along The Curve of Time. She said: In my mind I always think of that Summer as the year we wrote down our dreams. The children always called it The Year of the Bears!
