Please keep an eye out for yellow badges, and help welcome them to our wonderful and unique community.



Chili Recipe Feb 2025

INGREDIENTS:

2.5-3lbs ground beef 85-90% lean

2-3 jalapenos minced

2 large (28 oz) cans of whole or crushed tomatoes

1 15.5 oz can each: pinto, kidney, black beans

1 large onion cropped

1 each: green, yellow, red bell pepper cropped

3 cloves garlic

1/3+ cup chili powder

1 tablespoon Cumin, smoked paprika, salt

1 teaspoon ground pepper

PREPARATION:

- 1. Melt 2 Tablespoons of butter in a large skillet to brown ground beef, add jalapenos.
- Transfer Beef to Crock Pot
- Add Chili powder, Cumin, Paprika, Salt and Pepper on top of Beef
- Add tomatoes and beans to Crock pot
- In Skillet, cook chopped onion, peppers and garlic until softened
- Transfer veggies to Crock Pot
- Cook on Low for 5 hours and serve with shredded cheddar cheese

Race Management Fleet - Calling All Members

A successful race or series cannot be achieved by one person alone; it requires a strong team. Each member of the team plays a vital role. The team positions include Principal Race Officer, Wind Reader, Scorer, Sounder, Line Sighter, Spotter/Recorder, Signaler, Timer, and Support Boat Operator, among others.

If you're interested in being on the water to support our racing program with a great group of fellow members, please join us on the 2nd and 4th Thursdays of each month. Meetings will be held in the conference room at 6:30 p.m.



Last month the cruising fleet hosted a safety at sea presentation by Martin Lopez that described the fire and helicopter evacuation that he and his crew experienced off the coast of Mallorca, Spain. Approximately 50 people attended and were treated to a detailed description starting with discovering smoke on their 40 ft chartered catamaran, how they did their best to smother the fire while they awaited rescue, the expertise of the Spanish Coast Guard crew, and the challenges after being shoreside as they had no passports, no money, no credit cards, and only the clothes they were wearing. The boat ultimately was engulfed in flames and sank. Martin noted that staying calm, having a solid crew, staying with the boat as long as possible, use of the EPIRB to get help (VHF is line of sight communication only), and previous safety training were essential to their survival. Eric and Barbara DeCuir, from our Coast Guard Auxiliary, supported and recommended safety training courses for us all. If you missed the briefing, you can find the slide presentation on the Cruising Fleet Page of the KHYC website.
