COMMODORE'S CORNER

OK folks, I think I owe you an apology for last month's article. If it didn't make a lot of sense to you, it is because in the process of editing for the production of the magazine we had to cut a few words; and, in the heat of the action, we chose to delete a couple of paragraphs that might have obscured the meaning of the piece. These things happen. Hopefully you made it through the bumpy transition to get something out of it. Meanwhile, as long as I am on corrections and retractions from the last Tell Tale, I should clarify that the young sailor racing on the King Harbor Race Team in Long Beach Race Week, was Ruby Wright, not Golden Globe winning actress Robin Wright. Ruby has a bright future as she heads out to her freshman year at Exeter. Go Ruby!

It is hard to believe that we are already getting to the "end" of summer. As of this writing, we only have four more Twilight races left. My boys will be back at MCHS in a week (they're so excited). The frenetic pace at the club through July is starting to taper...and I'm eyeing the end of my run as your Commodore. There's still a lot to do including nailing down a bigger and wider Holiday Boat Parade with Pat and the whole Marina Community, and preparing for officer nominations for our 2026 year.

Meanwhile, in this article, I thought I would take a moment to discuss another task for 2025 that people know a bit about but maybe not as much as they want: The budgeting process. This is where operating income is estimated, operating expenses are planned, and capital dollars are set aside for expenditure in the upcoming year. Of course a budget is just a plan, and you know that old saying: "Men plan, God laughs". Last year I entered this process with a plan of my own. I thought it was a great idea that would address three critical challenges that we face as a club:

- 1) A "shortfall" of perceived value vs. costs to join KHYC, which depresses new member volume.
- 2) A shortfall of operating dollars to pay for services we need around the club.
- 3) A lack of resources allocated to non-sailboat racing members

My solution turned out to be highly controversial, which I did not anticipate. The idea was for KHYC to buy a Duffy Boat (12-person electric boat of very low speed) for chartering by the members of KHYC exclusively. It turns out some were strenuously against this idea. There was a fear that it would be unmaintained and fall into ruin, and another fear that it would become a liability as our members would not succeed in safely navigating the waters inside the marina. There were other issues with the realization that King Harbor Marina is not exactly MDR, Los Alamitos, or Newport Harbor, and people would be bored quickly, and rentals and income would stop. We will get to find out how it turns out, because now there is a company chartering a Duffy boat in our little Marina. I will be keeping my eyes on how this for-profit business will do. Why am I bringing this up now? Because the budgeting process is where ideas get launched for the first time. That time is now. Your flag officers and directors are working hard to solve complicated problems of income and expense....of balancing the need for new members and associated income, but without overexposing the club to unreasonable expectations.



The reality of our club is that we are limited in our income vs. other yacht clubs because we do not control and manage slips. This is the biggest money maker for most clubs. For us, it's the \$138/month membership dues. That is an extremely limiting factor in our ability to provide services to you. But, you have to play the hand your delt.....unless you can convince the dealer to play a different game. This is how we win: **Great members, great events, great fun! King Harbor Yacht Club!**

I hope everyone has been enjoying the wonderful summer weather and schedules, with lots of opportunities to get out on the water and enjoy all the vessel types that appeal to you. Congratulations especially to the team who worked so successfully with the Santa Barbara Yacht Club on the 51st Annual Santa Barbara to King Harbor Race!

One of the real beauties of our club is the diversity of waterborne and waterside activities that our members enjoy, and the broad array of our members who share multiple and common interests. One of the advantages of membership at KHYC is the availability of mast up moorage for boats of a size that can be stored out of the water. Not to mention other watercraft such as kayaks and SUPs. The rates are very attractive and access to our hoists and tugs makes it far simpler than hauling or towing your vessel from your garage or driveway to a boat launch, then finding parking for vehicles and trailers, etc. This benefit is now managed by a committee of our members, through a license agreement that is renewable annually by approval of the board of directors. The committee has been doing a wonderful job of managing the wait list for members who need space not currently available. The East Yard is full, or nearly full, almost all the time now. It's important to note that there's a difference between moorage (temporary dry storage of a vessel between regular usages) and storage, which can sometimes look more like my garage. We are grateful to our member licensees for their efforts in the last year to clean up their space and rid the boat yards of items that are out of bounds.

More importantly, we're committed to maintaining an environment in which our licensees can safely be on the water in their boats, kayaks and paddle boards without any hassle at all. *We wish you all the best in your waterborne adventures, enjoying the Wonderfully Endless Summer of the California South Bay!*



Dean O Bray passed away peacefully early August 3rd, 2024. Born in 1926, he became interested in sailing after moving to the Los Angeles area in 1949. He gave his wife, Grace, a choice; that he could either start flying or sailing. She chose sailing. After building his own Penguin dinghy to race in the newly built King Harbor, he joined what would eventually be King Harbor Yacht Club. In the late 1960's, he and his son, Steven, won the West Coast Nationals with their 32' racing sloop, *Fair Lady*. He was an avid boat builder with four major efforts to his name; a Penguin dinghy, *Gail Bait*; a Sabot, *Woodstock*; a row boat, *Lena*; and a kayak (unnamed). He was an active member of several fleets and often helped with race committees. He was a member of KHYC for 60 years.

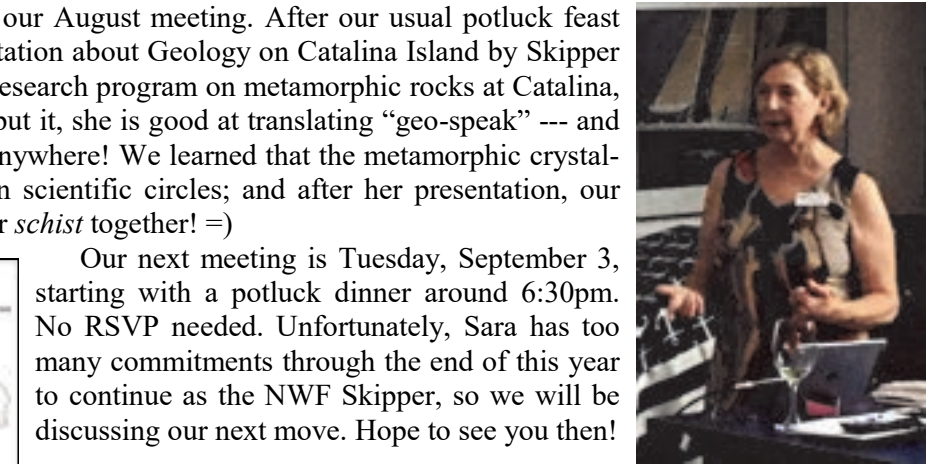
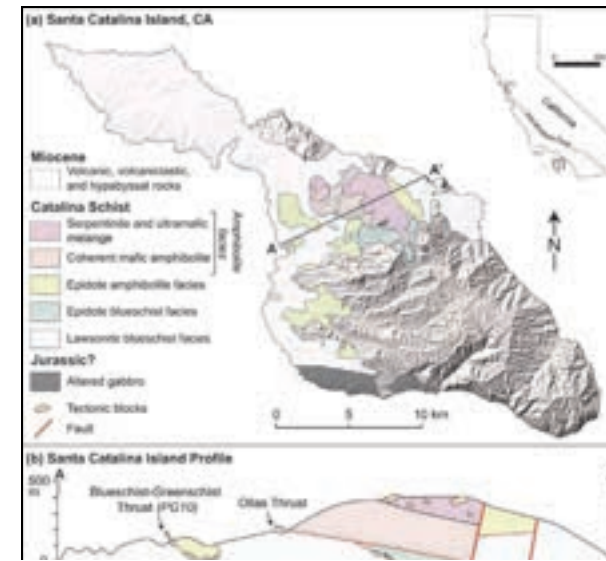


NIGHT WATCH FLEET

BOOK CLUB REVIEWS

In August we reviewed *"The Women"* by Kristine Hannah. When twenty-year-old nursing student Frances ("Frankie") McGrath hears: **Women can be heroes!** Those words became a revelation... Raised in the sun-drenched, idyllic world of Southern California and sheltered by her conservative parents, she has always prided herself on doing the right thing. *But in 1965, the world is changing, and she suddenly dares to imagine a different future for herself.* When her brother ships out to serve in Vietnam, she joins the Army Nurse Corps and follows his path. So when we, the readers learn that the farewell party in the opening scene of the book is for Frankie's older brother "a golden boy" who is leaving to serve in Vietnam in 1966, we already know that poor Finley McGrath is marked to die in the story, still, it's a surprise when the fateful doorbell rings less than 20 pages later. His death inspire Frankie to enlist as a *Combat Nurse* (sort of speaking), and this turn of events is just the beginning of a roller coaster of a plot that renders the experiences of the young women who served in Vietnam in all-encompassing detail.

The first half of the book, set in gore-drenched hospital wards, mildewed dorm rooms, and boozy officers' clubs, is an interesting read, tracking the transformation of virginal, uptight Frankie into a crack Surgical Nurse and woman of the world. As green and inexperienced as the men sent to Vietnam to fight, Frankie is over-whelmed by the chaos and destruction of war. Each day is a gamble of life and death, hope and betrayal; friendships run deep and can be shattered in an instant. In war, she meets-and becomes one of-the lucky, the brave, the broken, and the lost. But war is just the beginning for Frankie and her veteran friends. The real battle lies in coming home to a changed and divided America, to angry protesters, and to a country that wants to forget Vietnam. *"The Women"* is the story of one woman gone to war, but it shines a light on all women who put themselves in harm's way and whose sacrifice and commitment to their country has too often been ignored. A novel about deep friendships and bold patriotism. *The Women* is a richly drawn story with a memorable heroine whose idealism and courage under fire will come to define an era. In her research to write this book, Kristin Hannah read several memoirs by nurses who served in Vietnam. *The novel debuted at number one on The New York Times fiction best-seller list for the week ending February 10, 2024.* As of the week ending March 30, 2024, the novel spent 8 consecutive weeks atop the list.

I just finished reading it and guaranty that you will really like it! The book interweaves the true tales of Daniel Burnham, the architect behind the 1893 Chicago World's Fair, it not only highlights the creation of the World's Fair, but it also intertwines a story of a simultaneous episode of serial killing. Hence, the "Devil" in the White City.

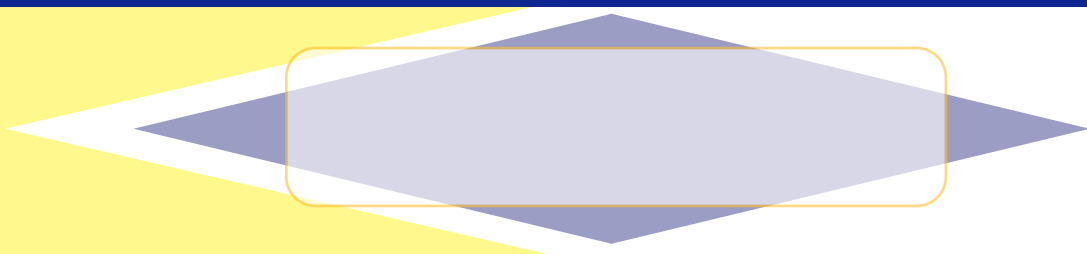
