Another month and another incredible party thrown by Katie Gonzales! This one was out at Isthmus beach on the Saturday of Labor Day weekend. The undefeated Mai Tai machine appeared, and promptly dispatched the crowd into a boozy afternoon of beach fun and frivolity. King Harbor Yacht Club's instantly curated Kubb Viking "Kings" team, won our inaugural Beach Kings Superbowl and is set for a rematch next year. Don't miss the 2025 Labor Day party at the Isthmus beach!

I'm two articles away from riding off into the sunset with my future of model sailboat racing, deviled egg eating, and reminding everyone how great things used to be around here. Last month I wrote about the challenges of the budget and how our club has limited sources of operating income, derived almost entirely from our members' dues. As our club grows into a modern, full-service organization that the South Bay demands, we always struggle to provide higher-end services without additional income streams. I referred to "playing the cards we have", and that would be to maximize membership. Our by-laws state that we're allowed to have 550 full paying members, and we never quite get there. Gaining 35 members would add a lot of operating income. It's in all our best interests to get our membership full and have a healthy waiting list of future members in the wings. I also talked about "getting the dealer to change the game". This is happening now! The Marina Interface Committee has been working behind the scenes for decades, led by S/C Marty Burke, to find a way to secure a long-term, economically viable future for this club. I joined the Marina Interface Committee five years ago, and it took me a while to learn the history of the different efforts (there have been many) to gain a long-term lease extension. Marty's position has always been that our club's future depends upon attaining slips. Nearly every yacht club of any significance has slips that provide operational income as well as an attraction for new members. Marty saw that we could never live up to our potential without these assets. Most people didn't believe it could ever happen, including me at first, but Marty won me over. The Marina Interface Committee has now delivered a proposal to the City of Redondo Beach to do just that: "Start a direct lease, beginning at the completion of our current lease, between KHYC/KHYF and the City of Redondo Beach for the Mole 'A'club location, plus a quantity of docks and slips". Although the City has only acknowledged receipt, there is a real possibility of something good happening in the next year, and we need everyone to lean in. First, if you live in the City of Redondo Beach, reach out to your Council member, build a rapport, and remind them that KHYC/KHYF is the longest continuous resident of the Marina and is the most dependable partner the City could have. Respectfully emphasize that we are an organization that cares as much about the success of this marina as the City themselves. All of us who may have relationships with City politicians, city employees, and just residents, should politely and consistently point out that our not-for-profit organizations of KHYC and KHYF are the best partners the city can have. No profits are being siphoned out to some other investment. All the money stays in the Marina! Also, please mention the long list of public services that the Club and the Youth Foundation provide for the community. Now more than ever, we must increase our value to the community. If you have any questions, please approach the Marina Interface Committee or the flag officers. We all are looking to make this work out for the best for KHYC, KHYF, and our beloved City of Redondo Beach. We can do this! We can fulfil Marty's dream and grow this club into something as special as a late summer night at Redondo Beach. This is how we win: Great members, great marina, great City... King Harbor Yacht Club!



## VIEW FROM THE REAR by: Denny Browne, Rear Commodore



Greetings from Deb and Denny, who are having fun in Barcelona, Spain! But the following article is mostly compliments to Katie Gonzalez, 2025 Rear Commodore Nominee, Cruising Fleet Skipper and invaluable member of the *Yard License Committee*.

Also, thank you to Katie and to Lisa Falk and all the other members of the committee for your tireless efforts to make this amenity available to the members.

If you have a vessel that would get more use stored out of the water, please get in the waiting list for space in the *yard*. The space, combined with our two hoists, are a valuable amenity for our members. The Club offering its members yard licenses for *Dry Moorage* is important for club revenue, attracting prospective members and retaining existing members. It's a valuable member amenity to be able to offer low priced *Dry Moorage* adjacent to the water, that includes *Mast-Up Dry Storage for sailboats* and which also includes easy access to motorized movers & hoists.

The rates are below market rate even with proposed increases. Since 2023 the Yard License Committee has worked together on regularly inspecting the yards, communicating with members to encourage compliance with policy, finding spaces for "wait listed" members, and reviewing license files to confirm vessels in yard have current license agreements, registration and insurance on file. This is a County requirement, and the County does annual inspections of KHYC files and yards to confirm compliance.

The Yard License Policy was also updated in 2023 to address uses of licensed spaces and "the members in the waiting list". Dry Moorage in the East Yard and Patio is for members' vessels that are regularly used! And that are also operational; it's not for long term storage or repairs.

The Committee is happy to report that in 2024, there was movement of "the waiting list" with 12 members receiving new licenses or moving to better suited spaces for their vessels.

Members pay a \$50 non-refundable application fee to be added to the yard "Waiting List" and they can pass on a space offer twice before being removed from the list. But ofcourse, they can pay another application fee to join the waiting list again.

Throughout this year, the Committee inspected the yard regularly and contacted members to encourage compliance with the published yard policy. The Committee also sent out 16 email notices to "correct Issues" in August. The Committee inspected the yard spaces on Sept. 6th and observed many of the licensees had corrected the issues, or that the issues were in the process of being corrected. All Yard Licenses are due to expire on December 31, 2024 and new license agreements are required for 2025. I Hope you're all enjoying your time on, in or near the water!

DATE: September 15, 2024

This is a notice of appeal pursuant to Art. VI, Sec. 12 of the KHYC By Laws.

#### BYLAWS - ARTICLE VI - BOARD OF DIRECTORS

SECTION 12. Appeals may be taken from any decision of the Board of Directors to the Club membership and such appeal shall be determined by a two-thirds majority vote of the members present; notice in writing of such appeal shall have been given by the Secretary to all Regular members at least 10 days in advance of such meeting. At the August 19, 2024 Board of Directors meeting the board considered and voted to reject the following proposed change to Policy 6.2 E.14 regarding private parties on holiday weekends:

No private parties will be permitted on Fridays, nor during the last two weeks of December, nor on any of the following holidays: New Year's Day, Easter, Independence Day, Thanksgiving Day, and the entirety of the Memorial and Labor Day weekends.

Mr. Murrell has requested an appeal of this board decision. Pursuant to our club by-laws the club membership shall vote on the appeal at the **November 22**, **2024** General Meeting on the upper deck starting at **7:00 p.m.** Please note that regular and dual members are only permitted <u>one vote per membership</u>.



#### **BOOK CLUB REVIEWS**

In September we reviewed "This is Happiness" by Niall Williams. The story begins with the announcement that change is coming to Faha, a small Irish parish unaltered in a thousand years. For one thing, the rain is stopping. Nobody remembers when it started... Rain on the western seaboard is a condition of living. But now just as Father Coffey proclaims the coming of the electricity (the town is about to install electrical power), the rain clouds are lifting and seventeen-year old Noel Crowe is idling in the unexpected sunshine when Christy makes his first entrance into Faha, bringing secrets for which he needs to atone. You don't see the rain stop, but you sense it. Though he can't explain it, Noel knows right then: Something has changed! As the people of Faha anticipate the endlessly procrastinated advent of the installation of electricity, and Noel navigates his own coming-of-age and his falling in and out of love, Christy's past gradually comes to light, casting a new glow on his small town world, much like a100 watts light bulb in the middle of a large room, where wonder of wonders, he can see clearly who is standing on the other side of the room.

"This Is Happiness" is a tender portrait of a community, its idiosyncrasies and traditions, its paradoxes and kindnesses, its failures and triumphs and a coming-of-age tale like no other, luminous and lyrical, yet anchored by roots running deep into the earthy and everyday existence, it is about the power of stories: Their invisible currents that run through all we do, writing and rewriting about us, and the transforming light that they throw onto our world and into our minds. While reading this book I could not help it but to ask myself a torrent of questions: What does happiness mean? When do you feel happiest? Can you describe one of the happiest times of your life? Who is the happiest person you know? Are you a happy person? And as I kept reading I also asked myself: What do you think makes animals happy? How do you know when a dog is happy? Does weather affect happiness? What makes you smile or laugh? Are you happy by simply being there? Then, all of a sudden it dawned on me:

"To be or not to be, that is the question"

On our first weekend of racing, our High School sailors participated in the CFJ Shadden Series at Newport Harbor Yacht Club. Joaquin DesRochers and Arianna Yiakas competed in interesting conditions with abnormally light and shifty winds and placed 13<sup>th</sup> overall.
