COMMODORE'S CORNER by: Andy Beggs, Commodore



Fall is here! Somehow it feels like June with this persistent fog bank sitting on top of us, but it's October. Fun times, for all of you who joined me in my lederhosen at the Octoberfest party! It's not October until you do the chicken dance. My new personal motto: "Chicken dance like no one is watching".

Meanwhile, I continue to spend a lot of time thinking about the club, and our potential for the future...

What I'm realizing is that there are not a lot of "comparable" clubs that work quite like we do. We're medium-sized by membership quantities. There is a club of similar size; and, like them we don't have slips and slip income to buoy us. But what they do differently from us is that their monthly dues, while in total are about the same, go mostly to operating income. They handle major construction projects with special assessments. We're banking a significant amount of your monthly overall payment into a new building fund, as you know. The goal is very much to NOT have a special assessment when it's time to do major construction on Mole "A".

Galley service is an area that we're watching right now. As you know, we serve about four seated meals per week, plus "light fare" on other days. Other clubs like ours are offering 10 or more seated meals per week, and are able to generate twice the galley income than we do. That allows them to spread the fixed costs across more meals, which is more efficient. One way we make up for the limited demand in food service from the membership is to lease to outside events. I'd very much like to see us serve more meals to members per week, but realize that unless there is demand, that idea will backfire. One solution to this is to have more members which will increase demand for meal service. Another alternative is to not have an in-house galley at all, and use outside catering whatever meals we provide, which some clubs do. I've become partial to Chef Marco's cooking though....

I was reminded recently by someone that our views from upstairs at the club are unmatched by yacht clubs or restaurants. What inevitably happens, however, is for those of us who enjoy the view from the club every day, we become blinded to the magnificence of our perch. None the less, only we have these Catalina-to-Pt. Dume views of the sun setting over the Santa Monica Bay. We need to take better advantage of this asset!

Ultimately the big item that can propel KHYC into our future is a new lease on Mole "A" and the potential to operate docks and slips. Once our future is certain, we can start planning in earnest for what our new club can be, and how we can best serve our current and future members. We could be close to achieving our future right now! As a reminder of what our future could look like, I'm posting the architectural renderings of one imagined future clubhouse. Don't get caught up on the details, the actual design will probably look a lot different from this....but this to me symbolizes the future that is awaiting us if we lean into this effort with the City today. Our future is as close as that next wind line!

KHYC BUDGET AND FINANCE COMMITTEE NOTIFICATION. by: S/C Lee Coller, Chairman

2025 Budget and Finance Telltale Submission

This year's budget and finance committee consists of S/C Lee Coller – Chair, Treasurer Amy Kim, Commodore Andy Beggs, Vice Commodore James Lee, Rear Commodore Denny Browne, Rear Commodore Elect Katie Gonzales, and Club Manager Mike Hyler.

The budget and related fees were approved by the Board of Directors at their October meeting. At the November 22^{nd} general membership meeting the budget will be presented and the membership will be asked to approve the proposed dues and assessments.

The board has approved an operating budget for 2025 of \$2,274,566 in income and \$2,273,781 in expenses for a surplus of \$785. Major points of this budget:

- 1. 10% increase in Food & Beverage costs.
- 2. \$8/month increase in regular dues and corresponding percentage increases in Flag/Jr Flag and Junior dues
 - a. Note that for the last several years we have defined the dues for the other categories as a percentage of regular dues. Flag members being 50%, Jr Flag 27% and Junior 11%
- 3. Increases in Race Fees
- 4. Boat Yard increase to \$8/foot

In October we reviewed *The Devil In The White City* by Erik Larson. The book UPCOMING REVIEWS: is really two stories under one book cover, it interweaves the true tales of Daniel Burnham, the architect behind the 1893 World's Fair, and Dr. H. Holmes, a serial killer who lured his victims to their deaths in his elaborately constructed "Murder Castle", his mansion, built adjacent to the white city. What makes the story even more chilling is that Holmes really lived, walking the grounds of that dream city by the lake. However, this book caught my attention for other reasons: Because of its mention of the legendary "1893 Chicago World's Fair", which was designed and put together by a famous group of Architects directed by Daniel H. Burnham AIA architect and urban designer. A proponent of the Beaux Arts movement, he may have been "the most successful power broker the American architectural profession has ever produced." Burnham overcame tremendous obstacles and tragedies as he organized the talents of Frederick Law Olmsted, Louis Sullivan, and McKim, **Mead and White** to transform swampy Jackson Park into the White City. That was the birth of "Landscape Architecture" applied by Frederick L. Olmstead: landscape architect, journalist, social critic and public administrator. He is considered to be the father of landscape architecture in the United States.

> So, when I was a freshman at the University of Illinois (Navy Pier) in Chicago, I was taking basic drafting courses, dreaming of some day becoming an architect. The U of I did not have an architectural department yet, but I knew that my drafting instructor was an architect, so I asked him for a job at his office. He did not need anyone, but he directed me to Graham Anderson Probst and White, a large firm in downtown

Chicago ("The Loop") which was expanding and were hiring. He told me: "Put your best drawings and sketches in a nice clean binder, wear a fresh shirt and tie with a jacket and schedule for an interview. Be polite but don't be shy and more importantly don't be late! Oh, and tell them I sent you" Well, I couldn't believe it, I got the interview, they made me draw a couple of details on a drafting board and free hand sketch the office in perspective... I got the job right then and there! Started three days later and ended up working there for 15 happy years. I learned a lot, our mantras were: Form follows function (Louis Sullivan's philosophy); and, Less is more (Mies van der Rohe's philosophy).
