This is it! This is the last Telltale article of my career as a flag officer. First, thank you to those who have read my posts over the years. I'm always a little surprised when someone comments about my writing. I forget that it's out there and people take the time to read it. *Thank you!*

"Thank you" is really the last message I want to convey to you all. Thank you for the honor of serving you. I did

my best. Some good things happened; some not so good things happened. I am happy to see people enjoying the patio furniture and fire pits. I was thrilled to see a big turnout for the Commodore's Cruise to Cat Harbor. I'm proud that we acquired a "new" (to us) committee boat to run our racing in a safer and more comfortable manner.

As I'm departing as flag officer this month, I do want to say thank you to all the volunteers that make this club work: the army of volunteers that work very hard to put docks in and out, so we don't lose them in the increasingly dangerous winter swells. Thanks to those souls who worked to try to dredge out boulders (by hand!) with me when we didn't think we'd get heavy equipment back out to finish the job at our western gangplank. Thanks to all the volunteers who put on parties, ran committees, acquired new members, decorated for events, cleaned up after events. Thanks to those who work to make the yard work, the docks work, the hoists work, and to do the constant repair of everything at the club facilities. It's a lot of work, a lot of hours, and more than a few pulled muscles and bruises. All of this is what it takes to make our club what it is. Finally, I'd like to thank our professional staff that are working often behind the scenes to serve us: Mike and Laura in the office, Marcos and his kitchen staff, Lupe and her serving staff, and all the hardworking folk that keep our home clean. I would also like to thank my family for putting up with me: The long hours of late meetings, the distraction from them. You deserve my full attention and focus, and you rarely get it. I need to change that.

The most important thing that I've worked on and will continue to work on is securing a long-term future for this club through a direct lease with the city. March 2032 may still seem a long while away, but the time to secure our lease is now. How the club ultimate looks when everything is said and done is certainly still to be determined, but I continue to look at the rendering that the Marina Interface Committee had commissioned to inspire me to continue working. What can we all do as members to give ourselves the best possible chance to secure a lease with the City? There's a lot we can do, so let me list them. I am asking members to keep a constant thought about the need for KHYC to be an exemplary neighbor in the Marina. That includes vigilance in following all the Marina rules including: no swimming in the harbor; no fishing off the docks; avoiding conflicts with traffic in the Harbor thoroughfare from racing of all kinds; and compliance to speed limits through the harbor (5 MPH and no wake). The City is watching and wants to see us be leaders of proper behavior on the water. Furthermore, I'm reminded that we need to keep our boat yards in Bristol condition with cleanliness and order being the priority. The City will be highly resistant to providing us with greater Marina responsibility (docks and slips) if they believe we aren't taking care of the assets we already control. We can all help here! Lets be the leaders that the City needs us to be! Let's keep working to win: Great members, a great future, a great City! King Harbor Yacht Club!

The holidays are coming, and I want to send special thanks to Rosie Vullo, John LaBue and Francie and Burr Hope, among others, for keeping our clubhouse, grounds and gardens in the best shape I've ever seen

them. These efforts contribute mightily to keeping KHYC members and their guests comfortable and attracting new members to the club. With a lot of influential visitors headed our way for the Boat Parade, as well as our own holiday gatherings, it's great to see everything looking and working well.

In anticipation of removing the docks after the Boat Parade, all new wheels need to be installed last weekend on the pallets that hold the docks. The wheels were damaged or just worn out from the harsh saltwater and salt air, so special thanks to Ed McLaughlin for organizing a great crew of volunteers, including himself, Commodore Andy Beggs, Tom Priest, Dan Gonzalez and other skilled members to get the old ones off and the new ones attached. We're now ready to take the docks out on Sunday, December 15, the morning after the boat parade.

Special thanks to the East Yard committee, and the dozens of East Yard licensees, for getting the East Yard cleaned up and straightened out. This is an important feature, and a KHYC competitive advantage in attracting boats that live out of the water. The dry moorage offered by the East Yard attracts and retains members who now can launch their vessels within a few minutes, rather than driving to a dry moorage facility in a vehicle that can tow a trailer, then delivering the vessel to a public boat launch for the day to put the vessel in the water, take it out of the water, back to the storage facility and home.

Making this a practical way to use your vessel requires the two working hoists, which require regular repair and maintenance. Thanks to Bill Ziel, famous King Harbor Yacht Club Racer (Aloha, J/33) and industrial rigger, for putting a lot of time into the hoists recently to repair damage that's accumulated over the years. Bill has conducted repairs and upgrades to the structure that keeps the salt water from chewing up the hoists. Hope you had a wonderful Thanksgiving and everyone's looking forward to the holiday season! *Look forward to seeing you at the club!*





Based upon the written feedback, the responses regarding the most appreciated benefits of King Harbor Yacht Club (KHYC) among members show a variety of themes:

- 1. Youth sailing and family-friendly activities are valued.
- Social connections, such as camaraderie, friendships, and the friendly community, are frequently mentioned.
- 3. Club facilities like dock access, boat launch, dry storage, and shower rooms are appreciated.
- 4. Dining and bar services, including the quality of food and weekend service, are highlighted.
- Convenient harbor location and water access for various activities (SUP, moorage, sailing) are noted benefits.
- Yacht racing and sailing activities are frequently highlighted, indicating a strong interest in competitive and recreational sailing.
- Facilities, such as the hoist and location, are appreciated for their convenience and support for boating activities.
- 8. The view and scenic aspects of the club are mentioned as significant benefits.

Based upon the written feedback, the consistent themes for recommending King Harbor Yacht Club (KHYC) to friends among all members include:

- Strong Sense of Community: Many members express that KHYC feels like an extended family and a wonderful, welcoming community.
- Boating and Yachting Focus: Recommendations are particularly strong for friends who are active boaters or interested in yachting, racing, and cruising.
- Positive Experiences: Members generally report satisfaction with the club, sharing positive experiences and encouraging friends to check it out.
- Room for Improvement in Promotion: Some members feel the club could do a better job of promoting itself and its welcoming environment.
- Varied Appeal: Recommendations depend on what potential members are looking for; some suggest that KHYC may feel more like a country club than a traditional yacht club.



Urban Planning. Which eventually was used in Washington DC.
 Land Scape Architecture. Which is now a world wide profession.
 Dishwasher. Now we argue how to load and who gets to empty it.

4. Electrical lighting. On streets, and inside occupied buildings.

5. The Zipper. Unless you have dealt with garments using lacings, hooks and loops, you may not appreciate the invention of the zipper.6. The Ferri's Wheel. In the world, no carnival is complete with out it.

7.Shredded Wheat. Food still being sold in stores all over the country.

13.Commemorative Stamps and Coins. The U.S. Post Office jumped on the Fair's momentum with its first set of commemorative stamps, called *The Columbians*.
14.Wrigley's Juicy Fruit Gum. More than 100 years later, still sold everywhere.

<u>Second:</u> We reviewed "The Brain In Search Of Itself/Santiago Ramon y Cajal" by Benjamin Ehrlich. As the pioneer of modern neuroscience, Cajal is the most influential figure in the history of biology that you have never heard of, he was born on the 1st of May 1852 in the town of Petilla de Aragón, Navarre, Spain. As a child he was

transferred many times from one school to another because of behavior that was de-

clared poor, rebellious, and anti-authoritarian.


Along with Charles Darwin and Louis Pasteur, Cajal ranks among the most brilliant and original scientists of the nineteenth century, and his discoveries have done for our understanding of the human brain what the work of Galileo and Sir Isaac Newton did for our conception of the physical universe. Santiago Ramon y Cajal was awarded the Nobel Prize in 1906 for his life long investigation of the structure of neurons -"the mysterious butterflies of the soul", he called them - The New York Times.


