WINE NOT?



The June Boat in the Bottle wine group was hosted by John and Rosanne Klein. The theme was "Bordeaux Wines – Right Bank versus Left Bank". Left and right banks are defined relative to the Garonne, Gironde and Dordogne rivers in the Bordeaux region, with the left being the south eastern side. The left bank is known for its Cabernet wines while the Right is known for Merlot which favor the respective soil and terrain. The overall favorite of the evening was the white starter wine, Chateau Carbonnieux Blanc Pessac, 2023, rated in the "very good" range. All the red wines scored in the high end of the "below average" range due mostly to their young age of 4 years, these wines need more time in the bottle. There was no discernable difference between the left and right bank wines.

Each wine tasting is limited to 14 people, as one bottle serves 14 people. We meet once a month, if you are interested in joining the alternate list contact/text Susan Cloots at 310-251-7482.

KHYC is clearly in full swing now! Busy days and nights, great events, solid staff, and members enjoying themselves, friends, and the facility. The facility (my focus) is doing quite well given the support of the staff and the facilities team. We have had plumbing, painting, tile, refrigeration, fireplace, and electrical to upgrade and repair and for the most part we are up to date. We had a second race mark, "F" break free from its anchor and it was drifting off Manhattan Beach. Without hesitation the team of Ed McGlaughlin, Jason Herring, and Xavier Menendez hopped onto our RC boat "Phantom" and as sunset was nearing headed out and located the buoy (see photo)! They towed it back and the next week deployed both F and A marks. Today the only mark left to deploy is Y and we anticipate that happening before you read this article.

Ed McGlaughlin also replaced a section of tile in the galley that the health inspector noted was not sufficient and Jeff Johnson painted. Eric Carson repaired one of the refrigerator doors in the bar and Danny Keswater fixed the plumbing for the sink outside of the galley. We had a contractor clean out the galley sink drain that has been a perpetual problem and they repaired the leak in the plumbing that attaches to the fire box on the guest dock.

With fingers crossed by the time you read this the glass wind fence around the patio area should have been installed. Rosie Vullo, House Chair, is pricing replacement of the foggy tinting on some of our upper deck windows and investigating some additional tables and chairs for the upper and lower decks. We are looking to replace the rusty galvanized pipe railing at the west balcony stairs with vinyl hand rails. If all goes well the Army Corp will have completed their work repairing the breakwater wall adjacent to KHYC with minimal impact to our dock operations – They say 5 working days and they will move away from our area and... they don't need to remove our pilings or docks to do the job (previously they were going to remove and replace our pilings). KHYC is in great shape and continually improving!

Join us for the 34th Cure Cancer Cup Regatta for the Tom Collier Memorial Trophy on Saturday, July 11th, and the Model Yacht Tom Collier Regatta on Friday evening, July 10th.

Spend a fun-filled weekend at the club as we "March to a Million" in support of cancer research at Cedars-Sinai Medical Center. Together, we have raised more than \$863,600 in direct contributions to reach \$1 million by the regatta's 35th anniversary in 2027.

We are honored to welcome Ronald Paquette, MD, Director of Bone Marrow Transplant and Cellular Therapy at Cedars-Sinai. Dr. Paquette and his colleagues are developing promising treatments for blood and bone marrow cancers through donor stem cell transplants.

On Friday, the Model Yacht Fleet will race remote-controlled DF95 sailboats in front of the clubhouse. Sign-ups begin at 4:30 p.m., with racing shortly afterward. The NOR and SI are available at www.tomcollierregatta.org. Watch from the patio or bar.

Saturday's festivities feature an inverted-start sailboat race visible from the clubhouse, with exciting finishes as most boats cross the line around the same time. For racers, the Cure Cancer Cup Regatta is ASMBYC Highpoint #7. Sign up in person at Twilights on Thursday, July 2nd or July 9th, or on race morning. Shore-side events begin at 2 p.m. and include a live band, live and silent auctions, an opportunity drawing, appetizers, a taco cart, remarks from Dr. Paquette, and the trophy ceremony. Club members and guests are welcome. Entry is \$35 per person and \$20 for children under 10.

BOOK CLUB

In June we reviewed **"Frozen River"** by Ariel Lawhon, The New York Times best-selling author of *I Was Anastasia* and *Code Name Hélène*. This book is a gripping historical mystery inspired by the life and diary of Martha Ballard, a renowned 18th-century midwife who defied the legal system and wrote herself into American history.



Maine, 1789: When the Kennebec River freezes, entombing a man in the ice, Martha Ballard is summoned to examine the body and determine cause of death. As a midwife and healer, she is privy to much of what goes on behind closed doors in Hallowell. Her diary is a record of every birth and death, crime and debacle that unfolds in the close-knit community.

Months earlier, Martha documented the details of an alleged rape committed by two of the town's most respected gentlemen—one of whom has now been found dead in the ice. But when a local physician undermines her conclusion, declaring the death to be an accident, Martha is forced to investigate the shocking murder on her own. Over the course of one winter, as the trial nears, and whispers and prejudices mount, Martha doggedly pursues the truth. Her diary soon lands at the center of the scandal, implicating those she loves, and compelling Martha to decide where her own loyalties lie.
